#### ARTIST DESCRIPTION:

Modern, Contemporary, Pāsifika. I explore, experiment, and develop Pacific Island motifs and patterns in my own modern and individual style.

#### PREFERRED MEDIUM:

Acrylic paint and markers on canvas and heavy cartridge.

#### WHAT IS ART TO YOU?

Art to me now is an outlet that allows me to express who I am as a Samoan living in NZ and what has shaped me into the man that I am today. Art is also a stress release for me that gives me a sense of joy, peace and happiness.

#### WHAT MOTIVATES YOU AS AN ARTIST?

Always developing my style and never settling.

The need to step out of my comfort zone sometimes in search of a new style and a freedom to create something different from what I have done before. I am motivated by becoming better at my craft and always honing and developing my skill and talent. Seeing what other artists both new and old are doing also acts as motivation for me as an artist.

#### WHEN AND HOW DID YOU KNOW THAT YOU WANTED TO BE AN ARTIST?

I always said that if money was not an issue and I didn't have to work, that I would be an artist. So, art has always been something I was passionate about. But as I got older and busy doing other things, Art took a back seat in my life. After many years of doodling and sketching Pasefika patterns and designs in 2018, I bought an A3 sketch pad and started drawing in the style that I am known for now.

#### HOW DID YOU GROW IN YOUR INTEREST IN ART?

I have always been interested in art from a young age. At High School, I took art every year from 3<sup>rd</sup> Form to 7<sup>th</sup> Form as well as 7<sup>th</sup> Form Art History. More recently, social media platforms and the internet have meant that I have been able to see a huge range and variety of art and artists from around the world. I plan to see more local art exhibitions once Covid restrictions are lifted.

#### WHO WERE YOUR ROLE MODELS, ARTISTS YOU ADMIRED AND SUPPORTERS OF YOUR ARTISTIC JOURNEY?

Fatu Akelei Feu'u, Michel Tuffrey, Sopolemalama Filipe Tohi, Andy Leleisi'uao and John Pule. Raymond Sagapolutele, Iokapeta Magele-Suamasi and Benjamin Work are three artists and friends who I admire very much as artists and just good people in general. All three have been so generous with their time, advice, and contacts in supporting me in my journey as an artist.

#### WHAT WERE YOUR BIGGEST CHALLENGES IN YOUR ART JOURNEY?

Always pushing myself in terms of style and techniques. Not allowing myself to be too comfortable in what I'm doing. When I'm creating, the first person I need to please is myself and if I can do that - then other people will like it. This allows me to stay true to myself and not create for others approval.

#### WHAT ARE YOU INTERESTED IN EXPLORING IN THE FUTURE AS AN ARTIST?

I am really interested in creating murals in public spaces where it is free for anyone to view. I am also interested in exploring and creating artworks on a large scale.

#### WHAT IS YOUR ADVICE TO OTHER ARTISTS IN SOUTH AUCKLAND?

Find your unique style and stay true to yourself! Work hard at honing and developing your talent and skills. Be consistent and develop a good work ethic. I work on the principle of "Use it or Lose it!"

My role model is my old man. He's not an artist but has a hardworking mindset. I've always admired classical Russian authors in terms of their storytelling and the legacy of antiquity personalities. I have an Aunty who is my biggest supporter for my art.

#### WHAT WERE YOUR BIGGEST CHALLENGES IN YOUR ART JOURNEY?

Gear and crew. Film making is labour and resource intensive. To compensate, I've had to learn fundamentals to production, shooting and editing all on old rundown gear. I'm grateful for it though, as it's acted sort of like resistance training but for my art. On the few occasions where I've been granted a crew and/or gear, it's never been anything too overbearing thanks to already understanding fundamentals.



#### WHAT ARE YOU INTERESTED IN EXPLORING IN THE FUTURE AS AN ARTIST?

Leadership roles amongst other practitioners working towards a final goal. Maybe create work around/inspired by Pāsifika history as well as work on the unique diaspora of Pacific peoples around the world in the modern age. And a cartoon series.

#### WHAT IS YOUR ADVICE TO OTHER ARTISTS IN SOUTH AUCKLAND?

With only mud and stone they built the pyramids...YOU have the tools to communicate with the world! Go forth and make something big because nothings is impossible *I*
